- 7. Principal's report Ruth Reynolds (10 Minutes) Hybrid schedule update
 - a. Every school has safety plans if Marin County goes to red tier for 2 weeks can put all students back in the classroom at one time (will likely then be in orange)
 - b. Likely in March
 - c. Kids would come 4.5 hours (something like 8-12:30) 5 days a week with drop off times varying by grade like they currently do
 - d. 20-minute snack recess with school lunches taken home
 - e. Things to do in the afternoon more like homework & enrichment programs continue in the afternoon
 - f. Distance between desks is about 4 feet & districts asking to put in order for desks (currently some desks in K/1 belong to upper classrooms)
 - g. Has passed the board & teacher union approved it
 - h. Will classrooms still shut down with positive case would think yes
 - i. Any plan for kids to be COVID tested no plans resources at the Civic Center right now
 - j. Plexiglass between student desks haven't come up with that
 - k. Why not full day if can go back 4.5 hours there is a plan to transition but taking in increments to see how it's going
 - 1. Teachers vaccinated? Not in MOU but it's a wish; right now Marin concentrating on seniors
