6. Principal's Report - Alex Peck (25 min)

iReady testing is currently taking place. Your students are probably coming home from school very exhausted because test taking is exhausting.

Conference week: March 17-21. No School on Monday, March 17. Minimum day release Tuesday-Friday.

Conferences are a great opportunity to check in with your student's teacher to understand how your child is doing at school and how they're tracking towards end of year grade level standards. This is an opportunity for you to understand how you can best support your student. Ask your teacher about your student's strengths and opportunities for improvement. Also ask your teacher how your student is doing socially (on the playground, in PE, in the classroom) in addition to academically.

LPAC (State testing for K-5 English Language Learners) will be taking place later in March. As a school, we did really well and saw significant growth from the prior year. We're hoping to see additional growth this year.

SBAC State testing for grades 3-5 will be happening in May.

At the end of March we celebrate students district wide who are re-classified as English Language Learners.

5th Graders will go to Walker Creek for outdoor education (3 nights/4 days). Coleman is attending with Sun Valley and Laurel Dell. This is consistently a highlight of the elementary school experience.

Today, at school a student had a medical emergency and had to be transported to the hospital via ambulance. We believe a student had a seizure during lunch. Staff did a great job managing the situation, helping the student with the medical need and also the students around them to keep everyone safe and reduce fears. Staff contacted 911 and the student's family simultaneously. The student is undergoing additional testing but is out of crisis.

Word of the Week and Rainbow Positives give us an opportunity to have a shared language that is appropriate and applicable across our entire TK-5th school. The words of the week support the Social Emotional learning teachers are already doing in their classrooms. Kassy has created examples of what each Word of the Week looks like in action for each grade level. Teachers have 5 Rainbow Positives available to hand out for each word of the week. On Wednesdays, Student Council randomly selects 5 rainbow positives out of a basket to celebrate students and expand the social emotional learning at school through Word of the Week.

7. Green Team Week - Laura (2 min)

Last year, Coleman earned a Bronze designation for Zero Waist, this year we are trying to achieve Silver designation.
