- 3. Tiger Fund Month Results Liz Hall (7 minutes)
 - Pizza and Popsicle Party Winner (grade with highest participation percentage)
 - TK and Kindergarten grades tied for highest participation in Tiger Fund donations, both grades will enjoy a pizza and popsicle party!! (Trying to coordinate TK classroom from Short school to join TK classroom from Coleman for their Party)
 - Total Tiger Fund Donations:
 - \$52,684 raised through September 30 (over \$9,000 was raised via corporate matching donations!)
 - 45.7% overall school participation across all grades (this is slightly higher than previous years - yay! - but still want to increase overall participation)
 - Overall goal is to raise \$100K via Tiger Fund Donations we are halfway there, let's keep it going!
 - MugsyClicks Raffle Winners winners will be picked this week and communicated next week.
- 4. Revisions to PTO Budget Tracy Peck (5 minutes)

Per PTO bylaws, when expenses deviate from the approved budget by more than \$2500, the PTO must be made aware during the PTO Meeting.

- Coleman Branded Merchandise increase of \$2900 in upfront Branded Merchandise costs to purchase new Coleman Merchandise that will be on sale throughout the year

7. Principal's Report - Alex Peck (15 minutes)

Lots of great things happening on campus last month:

- Hispanic Heritage Month Celebrations on Campus was a huge success, thank you
 families and staff for volunteering to support these events and for joining the community
 celebration! It was a really special community event.
- United Against Hate Week this year activities were spread across two weeks instead of just one week. Classroom activities, lunchtime activities, all school activities.
- Mr Giao retired students, families, and school and district administrators celebrated Mr Giao with speeches, signs, cards, gifts. It was a very special celebration.

Welcome Mr Estuardo, our new custodian. He comes from Bahia Vista and has
experience launching and supporting Zero Waste efforts that he is already implementing
at Coleman. He is a great addition to the Coleman staff.

Coming up next:

- Student Council elections are underway, 3rd-5th graders participate as candidates and casting ballots. There are 32 candidates running for Student Council positions. Student Council runs the Wednesday morning meetings and offers opportunities for students to impact change at Coleman. Election results will be announced over the intercom Tuesday afternoon. Peaceful transfer of power will take place on Wednesday during Morning Message.
- Family/Teacher Conference Week: 10/14-10/18. No school on Monday 10/14, minimum day (early release at 11:50 am) Tuesday 10/15 Friday 10/18. Questions you can ask your teacher during your conference:
 - State testing and iReady testing results (these are important indicators)
 - What are the units they're learning about, how can I engage with my student by asking questions and having discussions about what they're learning at school?
 - How is my student doing socially/emotionally at school, how are they interacting with others?
 - Are there things I can do to support my student differently?
 - Think about and share with your teacher what your hopes and dreams are for your student for this year and the future.
- School Site Council meeting on Monday, October 21st at 5:00 pm via Zoom (check out the Coleman Family Calendar for the zoom link to join the meeting)
 - Discuss School Site Budget (district budget)
 - Input and feedback on writing the School Plan for student achievement
 - Aligning Title 1 federal funding with 4 school goals
- ELAC (English Language Advisory Committee) meeting on Thursday, October 24th at 6:00 pm via Zoom (check out the Coleman Family Calendar for the zoom link to join the meeting)
 - Discussion takes place in Spanish
 - Focus is on language development at school
 - Write goals focused on English Language Learners for SPSA (School Plan for Student Achievement)
 - Discuss state testing for English Language learners (which is different from what non-English Language learners state testing)
- Intentionality of this year's Master Schedule
 - Scheduled Specials (PE, Art, Music, Dance, Library, STEM) intentionally to allow Tier 2 instruction (small group instruction) across grade levels which increases opportunities for students to receive appropriate instruction according to their iReady assessments. Currently implemented with 3-5th grades.
 - Unfortunately due to construction and reduced space for recess, the Master Schedule may need to be adjusted to accommodate staggered recess times across grades which may impact the ability to continue and/or expand the planned Tier 2 instruction across grade levels.
- Attendance: Currently, Coleman is averaging 96.39% attendance which is an increase from last year, but is still lower than where we should be and where we need to be. We're aiming to have 98% attendance. Every 1% of attendance increases or decreases state funding the District receives by approximately \$500k annually!

- Please send students to school on Halloween even if your family doesn't celebrate Halloween. All parties and parades will take place towards the end of the day and alternate activities will be available for students who don't participate in Halloween. Communicate with your teacher in advance if your student should participate in an alternative activity on 10/31.
- Construction Update: Phase 1 (TK classrooms, additional Flexible classroom, Blacktop) and Phase 2 (Kindergarten playground, HVAC, Sound proofing in MPR, Electronic Marquee Sign) should be completed before August 2025.

8. Open Forum/Questions (10 minutes)

Question (Corinne): When people participate in PTO events and fundraisers (including Branded Merch) throughout the year, do these count as Tiger Fund donations?

Answer (Tracy): No, Tiger Fund and PTO Events and Fundraisers are tracked separately. Participating in PTO Events and Fundraisers do help us meet our overall annual fundraising goals and it's a fun and important way to support Coleman and fund PTO initiatives.

Answer (Melinda): When we speak about participation for Tiger Fund, it is specific to donations to the Tiger Fund. Ideally, we would like everyone to donate the full per child donation to the Tiger Fund but we understand that isn't always possible so we welcome any amount donated to the Tiger Fund to count towards our fundraising goals and overall participation percentage. We realize families make additional donations by participating in the PTO Events and Fundraisers, but we are hoping families will make a donation of any amount to the Tiger Fund and help us reach our highest participation rates yet.

Question (Corinne): What is the plan for the Field? Both immediately and for the future?

Answer (Alex): The original goal was to have Turf installed but there isn't enough Bond money leftover after Phase 1 construction to cover the costs for Turf. We will likely reseed new grass. We are supposed to close the field from November - February (we don't usually due to needing the space for kids to play during recess and PE). We are exploring using Dominican University facilities (parking lot and/or turf field) in the short term.

Comments (Melinda): Would having yoga or gymnastics matts be a helpful solution to minimize the amount of time students spend in the dirt during PE (planking on the dirt)? Volunteers - if you want to help fundraise/donate/or volunteer to help reseed the field, let us know!

Comments (Tracy): There are potential grant opportunities to help fund some of these initiatives but Grant writing does take time and expertise. If anyone has an interest or availability to help write Grants, please let us know!
