Coleman PTO is a 501-c non-profit organization that works to support the Coleman School staff, students, and community. Coleman is lucky to have a very strong and engaged parent network of volunteers and donors. We typically raise over \$200K through direct donations, corporate matching, and fundraising events.

Coleman also receives additional Title 1 funding from the San Rafael City School District and Coleman receives funding from HeadsUp Foundation and SchoolsRules Foundation who have equity-based funding models.

Not all San Rafael Public Schools have as engaged PTOs as Coleman and not all PTOs are able to raise nearly as much money to allocate to their school enrichment programs. As you'll see tonight when we review and approve our PTO budget, we are able to help fund important and valuable academic, social-emotional, and community building programs and experiences for our Coleman students and community.

SchoolsRule and HeadsUp are two additional Foundations that support Public School enrichment programs. HeadsUp is currently running their Annual Give campaign. You should have received an envelope in your student's Friday folder, this is not to be confused with the Coleman Tiger Fund annual give campaign that the Coleman PTO is currently promoting during the month of September. Please donate (any amount) to the Coleman Tiger Fund, all dollars donated directly supports Coleman School programs, students, and community. Please consider making an additional donation (any amount) to the HeadUp annual give campaign.

HeadsUp is San Rafael's public school Foundation that raises money and supports all San Rafael City Schools, including Coleman. We say it often, Coleman is a wonderful school and we're very fortunate to be able to provide so many wonderful and important enrichment programs for our students. In contrast to the \$200K+ Coleman PTO aims to raise annually, some San Rafael School PTOs work to raise \$25K for their school enrichment programs. 7. Principal's Report - Alex Peck (15 minutes)

It's been a great start to the school year! Even with construction on campus, students are doing really well, we're building community, teachers are off to a strong start!

Student Update:

1-5th Grade students are being assessed in Math and Reading using iReady now which will allow teachers to assign students into small groups for Tier 2 instruction. All students receive the same Tier 1 instruction together which is required grade level standard instruction. Tier 2 instruction is small group instruction that allows students to receive additional instruction specific to their current academic levels (at, below, or above grade level instruction). Tier 3 instruction is specialized instruction that not all students receive (special education, math or reading intervention). The Master Schedule has been designed to allow Tier 2 and Tier 3 instruction to happen at the same time across grade level bands.

Staff Professional Development Update:

- Continuing to do work in small groups (professional learning communities), teachers will have onsite staff Professional Development from our Instructional Coach
- Outside specialist: UC Berkeley History of Social Studies Project is helping us deepen the rigor within our Social Studies units
- Changing Perspectives: focusing on enhancing our inclusive practices for our students who have learning differences (expanding on work that was started last year)
- Race Work with Dr Lauri Watson Anti-Racism and Anti-Bias work focused on school
 policies to ensure we're providing the most equitable outcomes for all our students
 (looking at language, hate speech, inclusive practices for everyone)

On Campus and Construction Updates:

Shelter in place drill is coming up soon. A shelter in place drill is different from a lock down drill. The intent is to keep the outdoor parameter locked because there is something that could be unsafe happening near but not on campus (ie: a police chase in the neighborhood). All doors are locked, classroom instruction continues, PE is moved indoors.

Grade level directories will be released soon. Working towards being able to provide a full school directory next year.

Construction Update: Phase 1: Two new TK classrooms, TK play area, new multi-use classroom (After school Tiger Club and additional classroom space). Construction was very loud today, it will continue to be loud for a few more days. There was a lot of dirt blowing around today, it did not stop students from playing.

Phase 2: Update Kindergarten Playground, add shade structures, restripe blacktop play yard. Digital Marquee Sign (shared funding from district, Bond, PTO).

Phase 3: HVAC - likely 2027/2028 (timing depends on Bonds being sold)

8. Open Forum/Questions (10 minutes)

Comment: Stacey Farrel. Stacey leads the **Community Network** which supports our Coleman families and community. There are two main activities the Community Network coordinates each year: Halloween costume drive and Holiday Giving program in December.

If you have any Halloween costumes you can donate, please hang on to them and we'll be collecting donations in a few weeks - you'll be able to drop them off in a box in the Front Office.

Q. Crystal: Did I understand correctly that the small group instruction will provide specialized instruction not just for students who are below grade level and need additional support?

A. Alex: Yes, the intent is for students to be grouped together with homogenous groups (students at same/similar level) to work together either independently or with a teacher.

Q. Crystal: Is there any interest either this year or in future years to have a student-led service project?

A. Alex: Yes, but we need to figure out how it can fit into what is already provided and what teachers are already focused on leading and delivering within the classroom.

Q. Matt: When will construction end at Coleman?

A. Alex: Phase 1 should be complete by the end of July 2025. Phase 2 should begin in June 2025 and be completed in August 2025. Phase 3 is likely 2027/2028 (HVAC), dependent on sale of Bonds.

Q. Matt: Is there a plan to turn irrigation back on? Plants around campus are looking very dry and could really use more watering.

A. Alex: Irrigation should have been turned back on a week ago, Alex will follow up and confirm it is back on. SRCS maintenance was/is working with construction to get the irrigation turned back on. It was turned off because they had to dig an unexpected trench, that work is almost complete.

Q. Mixtly: Does the iReady assessment and intervention instruction include Kindergarten?

A. Alex: No, Kindergarten is focused on learning how to participate in small group instruction. Later in the Fall, students will begin focusing on learning their letters and numbers and phonics before they are assessed in November.

Comment. Melinda: Reminder - if you're doing a home improvement project or have a connection with a construction company or artificial turf company, we can always put donations to use!

Q. Anne: Very excited that the Kindergarten playground will get an improvement with Phase 2 Bond Construction. Can we start talking about when the larger play structure can/should be replaced/improved since we know it will take awhile to happen?

A. Alex: It would be great to start raising/saving money that can be put towards improving the large play structure. The quote for a full replacement is around \$500K. Trying to get the district to pay to place the soft rubber flooring below the play structure because that is ready/needing to be replaced now.
